SECOND DECLARATION OF KEALII MAKEKAU

Kealii Makekahu, for his declaration, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, states as follows:


1. I am over the age of 18 and I am of sound mind and am fully competent and authorized to make this declaration.
2. During the online registration process, I was asked to confirm the following declaration, which was called Declaration One: "I affirm the unrelinquished sovereignty of the Native Hawaiian people, and my intent to participate in the process of self-governance."
3. I object to the statement and the principles asserted in Declaration One. Therefore, I could not truthfully confirm Declaration One.
4. At no time during the registration process was I given the option to avoid asserting Declaration One.
5. At no time after the registration process was I given notice of registering without affirming to Declaration One.
6. Both during and after the registration process, I was not informed on the online website I could register without asserting Declaration One.

7. Once I declined to confirm to Declaration One, I was unable to register to vote on the Kana'iolowalu Roll.

8. I received no communication from any source telling me I did not have to confirm Declaration One to register.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
